


The Hunger Nation ...

Rafiki Mission

Rafiki (friend in Swahili) Mission launched in 2009 when pastor Jung, Hyosu and his family arrived in DRC from South Korea as a part of PMM (Pioneer Mission Movement) that was started by Northern Asia Pacific Division. It is based in Butembo City, North-Kivu Province.

Rafiki Mission is a channel of supporting from World Church, and trying to motive our churches to be active in evangelism. It has launched different kinds of project to help people and churches.

The Pioneer Mission Movement

PMM is a Global Mission Project of the Northern Asia-Pacific Division(NSD) for planting new church and nurturing the established but weak church in its territories. Its goal is to send as many church pastors as needed to other countries basically within NSD territories, and also outside the NSD territories for cross-cultural missionary work. These pastors are sent to primarily unentered territories where no Seventh-day Adventist church exists, and also to be sent to the weak churches. They commit themselves to enhance the second coming of Christ with Pioneer Mission Spirit.

From 2009, NSD started to send missionaries to other Divisions, and the first case was DR Congo. More than 48 pastors and their families are working in 13 different countries now. Especially 3 families of PMM are working in Africa, like DR Congo, Uganda and Tanzania.




Missionary Families (East Central Africa Division)




Sisterhood Project

- * This sisterhood project was started with Washington-Spencerville Korean Church in USA from last 2009, and many Korean churches joined together until we have 50 sister churches in NKF. The purpose of this project is not financial supporting, we planned to encourage and motivate churches to spread gospel to the world. So every sister churches have to have public evangelistic meeting twice a year at least, and have to report their mission activities every month.
- * Year 2009, baptism was 253, but in 2010 it was 769, and last year it was 1060. All the baptism of North-Kivu Field last year was 3542, so our 50 churches (12% of all the churches) made more then 30% of baptism. Not only baptism has increased, but also church members and tithe have increased.
- And we have supported amplifier system for more then 40 churches to help public evangelism.
- Apart this support, every year we have mission team from Washington-Spencerville Korean Church and evangelistic Meetings with our sister churches.

Church Roofing

- * Most of church buildings in DRC are mud buildings, and most of church members are worshiping on the dusty mud floor, and struggling to build good church of bricks and cement.
- * Most easy way of helping church construction is supporting tin roofing sheet. Because members can prepare bricks with their own labor, but most of them are poor farmers, they don't have money to buy roofing sheet.
- * To support one big church(10m*20m) is just \$1500.
- * Until May 2012, we have donated iron roof for 40 churches. It is almost 10% of the North-Kivu Field (270 churches, 159 Groups). The roof is most heavy burden of church construction here in DR Congo.

Lay Missionary Movement

To the end of the earth...

- * Our Field(North Kivu Field) has 429 churches and groups, but 45 pastors are working in the field. That's why many churches are left behind without taking care of. We have started this project to help churches and pastors, and to train lay people.
- * We trained 17 people of lay missionaries for 2 month and they have been sent to the different part of this Field on July 2010. They baptized 382 people within 6 month, and most of church where they are working increased their members and tithe 2~3 times. They are working like lay pastor.
- * And again we have trained 21 missionaries from May; and they were sent their mission field on 1st July this year.
- * To make more effective, we are changing our sisterhood project from churches to missionaries, so we are connecting our sister churches with our missionaries one by one, soon all missionaries will have their sister church which will support their mission activities.

- * They are going to school with scholarship, and have personal teachers after school. Because of malnutrition their brain couldn't developed well, so they are not easy to pass school exam, but this year all students have passed exam, andwe are trying to help them to be good people.


Technical Secondary School

Dream of future...




